On average, in 2018, the cost of holding people in federal custody was \$102.60 per day per adult, or \$37,449 a year.

The average cost for psychiatric treatment in a community hospital ranges from \$3,616 to \$8,509, depending on the type of illness being treated. A simple calculation reveals that for an adult, the cost of 35 to 83 days in prison would provide the financing of a hospitalization that would have a better chance of bringing about recovery.

Our Place Safe Haven serves as a vital resource on the road to recovery for mental health issues and homelessness. Our Pace Safe Haven is a 14-bed emergency shelter that provides basic needs for people working on turning their lives around. The most vulnerable receive mental health referrals, assistance in establishing a stable source of income, and help with obtaining permanent housing. Drop-in services include hot meals, showers, laundry facilities, phone messages, mail delivery and case management. We house homeless individuals throughout the County of Ventura from a variety of populations which include Veterans, TAY (Transitional Aged Youth), Seniors, along with individuals that are addressing mental health, substance challenges, and disabilities. We accept referrals by phone, walk-in or through agency partners at either One Stop location or our HMIS system.
